MINUTES OF THE MEETING

As per the Notice no. 156, dated 18/03/2023, issued by the college, the meeting of Board of Studies in Defence and Strategic Studies was successfully held on 05th April 2023 at 11:00 pm in the Department of Defence Studies, T. C. College, and Baramati. The meeting took place offline, adhering to the guidelines and protocols set by the college. Under the guidance of Dr. Devidas V. Bhosale, Chairman of the Board of Studies in Defence and Strategic Studies, the meeting commenced with a warm welcome to all the esteemed members, followed by a brief introduction of the meeting's objectives.

During the meeting, fruitful discussions were held on the items mentioned in the circulated agenda. We are pleased to inform you that the following resolutions were made during the BOS meeting.

1. To confirm the minutes of the BOS meeting held on 9th April 2022.

The minutes of the previous Board of Studies meeting were approved and confirmed.

2. To design and approve curriculum of S.Y.B.A Semester I and II (2022 pattern) to be implemented from the academic year 2023-2024.

The board carefully designed and deliberated upon the curriculum of SYBA Semester-I and II, aligning it with the guidelines of the college, for implementation in the academic year 2023-2024. During the discussion, certain modifications were suggested by the board members. Prof. Dr. C.B. Bhange proposed the addition of the concepts and objectives in grand strategy, strategy and tactics in UADS231 (A) Military Geography. Prof. Adinath Londhe proposed to include map reading into the curriculum to provide students with the geographic knowledge required to comprehend military geography. Dr. Devendra Vispute suggested inclusion of Sagarmala project in the study of Indian sea ports in the same course. Suraj Kale, a third year student, suggested a change in the curriculum to include information about strategic ports and islands in the context of map reading in line with the competitive examination. In UADS231 (B) change was suggested by Prof. Adinath Londhe regarding the inclusion of this related subject of String of Pearls strategy in the syllabus in accordance with China's increasing activities in the Indian Ocean. Dr. Devendra Vispute suggested including China's role in Indian subcontinent's geopolitics in the curriculum. Dr. Chandrakant Bhange suggested including arms control and disarmament in the chapter 4 of the course UADS 232 -International Relations. Lt. Gen. Avinash Chavan suggested including new diplomacy and functions of diplomacy in the same course. Furthermore, third year students Vivek Londhe and Omkar Kate suggested inclusion of India and Russia relations in the course to tackle competitive examination. Dr. Devendra Vispute suggested a change in the curriculum to include cyber security and disaster policy along with social media and its impact on national security in the course titled UADS 233 - India's Internal Security. Prof. Adinath Londhe suggested a change in the curriculum regarding the inclusion of many problems related to internal security of the country and its impact on national security in the same course.

The board thoroughly discussed and finalized the syllabus for the following

courses of SYBA Semester I and II.
