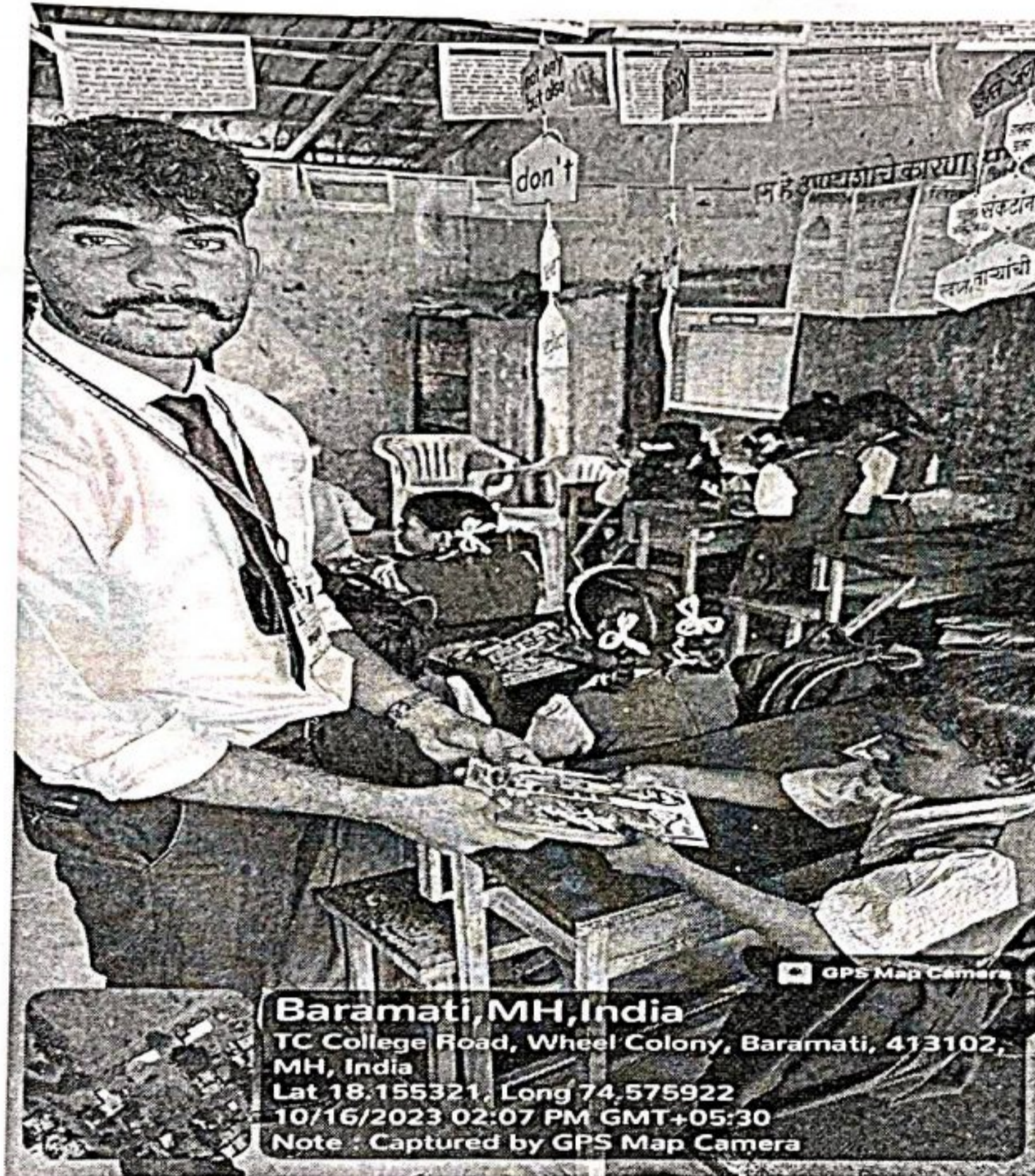
Project Launch:

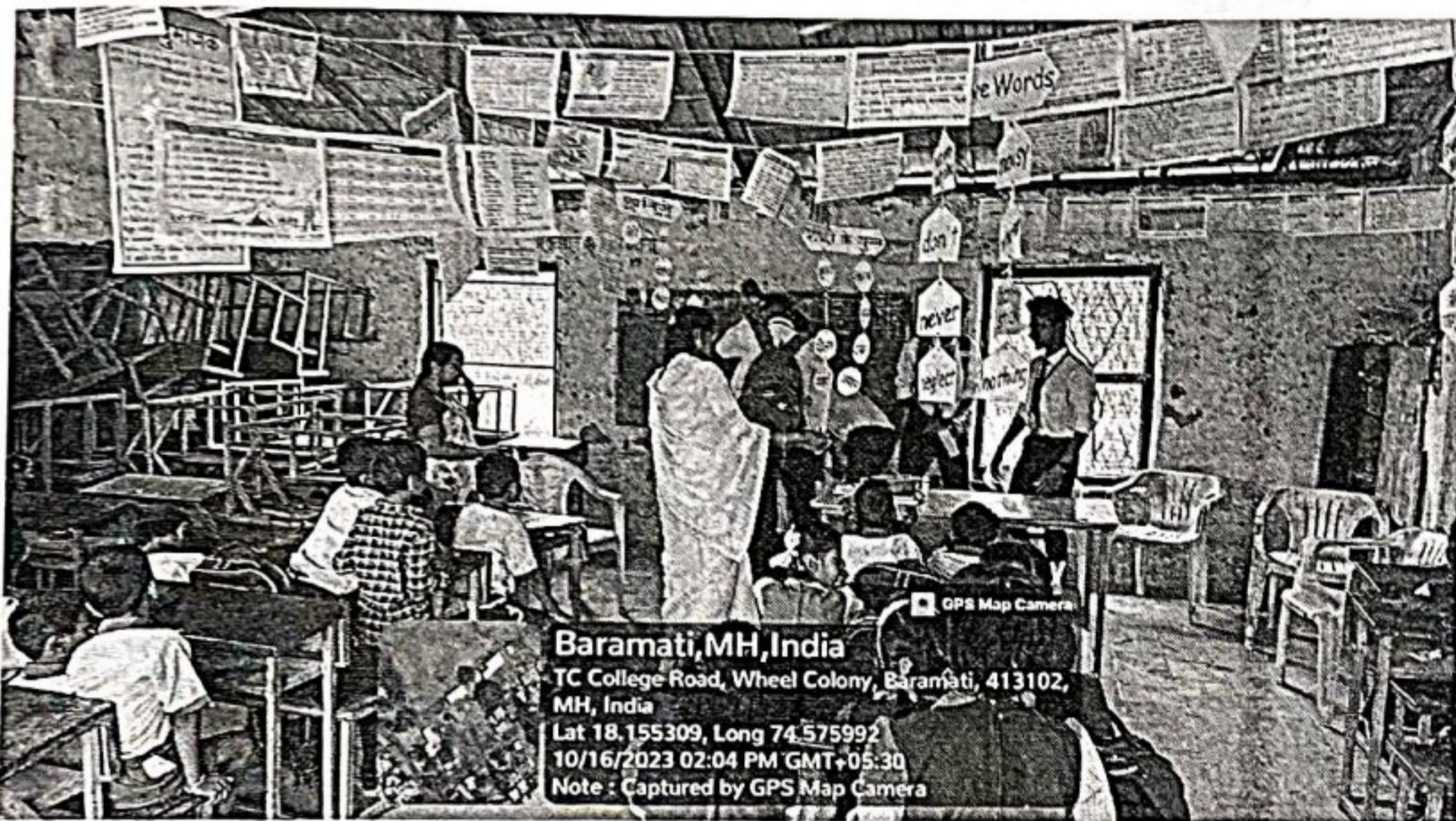
Welcoming Speech:

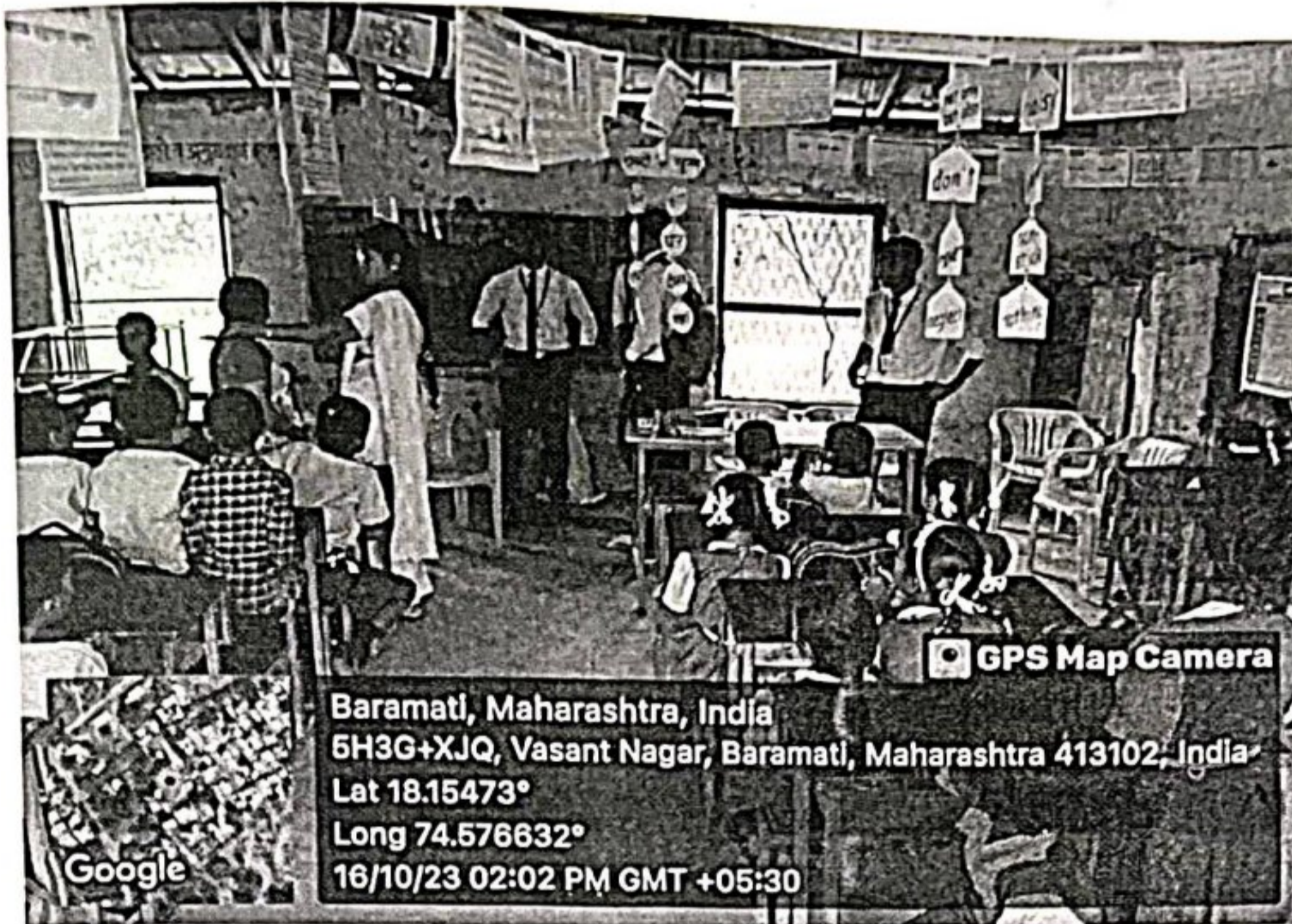
containing the essential stationery supplies and a geometry kit. Additionally, they were met with encouraging words and smiles from our team of dedicated volunteers.

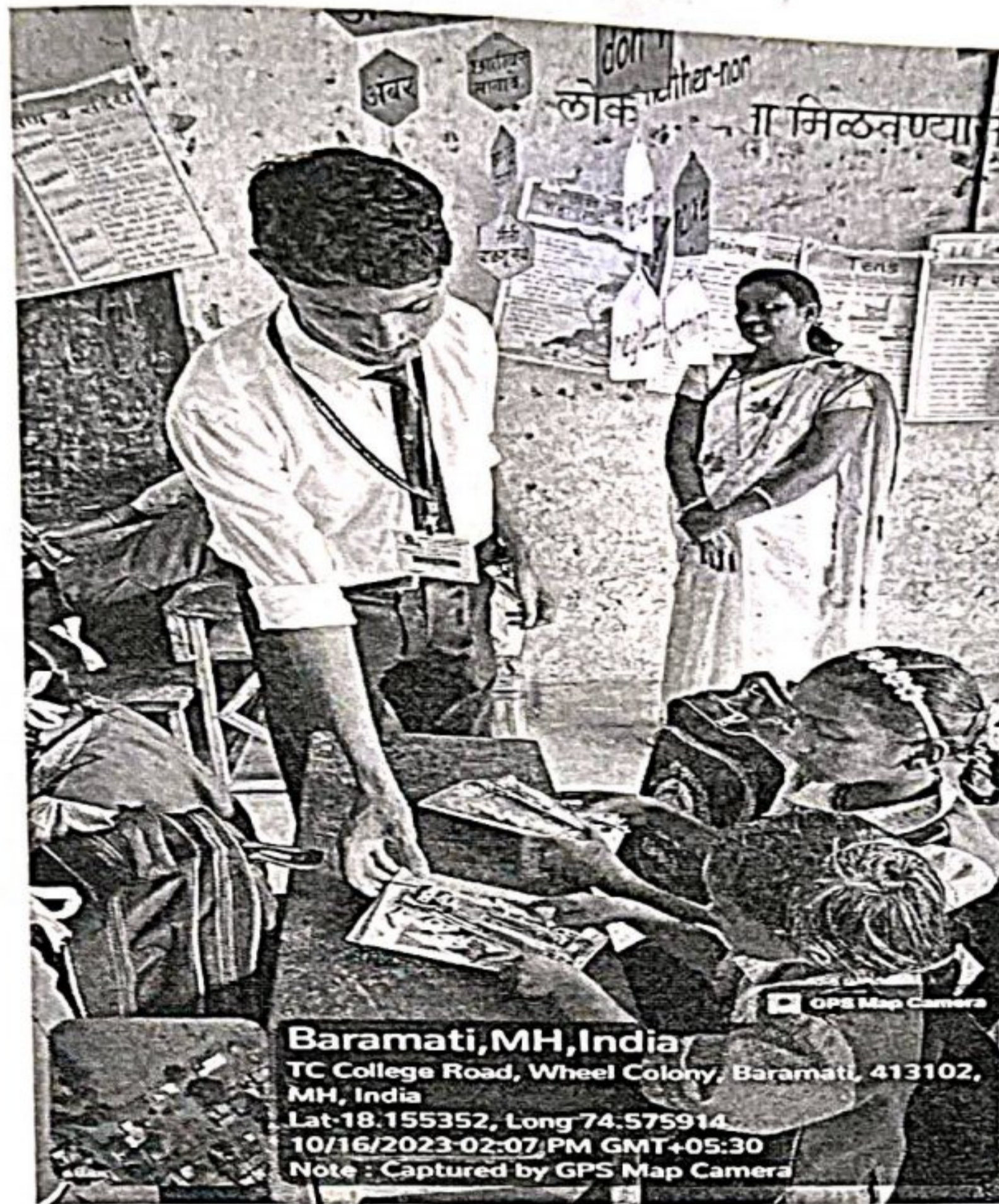




Financial Relief for Families:
