Report on Helping for Ganesh Visrjan (Ganesh Festival) for Environmental Awareness Date: 12/09/2023

The annual Ganesh Chaturthi festival is a significant cultural and religious event in India, marked by the installation and worship of Lord Ganesha idols. However, the traditional practice of Ganesh Visarjan (immersion of idols in water bodies) has raised environmental concerns due to the pollution caused by non-biodegradable materials used in idols and decorations. To promote eco-friendly practices, the National Service Scheme (NSS) students took an active part in the Ganesh Visarjan process, focusing on environmental awareness and sustainability. This initiative aimed to educate the public about the environmental impact of the Visarjan and encourage the use of eco-friendly materials, while also assisting in the safe and responsible immersion of idols. Total 26 NSS Volunteers participated for the event.

The key objectives of the NSS students' involvement in the Ganesh Visarjan for environmental awareness were: Awareness Campaigns: Before the Visarjan day, NSS volunteers conducted door-to-door campaigns and distributed leaflets about the environmental impact of plaster of Paris (PoP) idols, chemical paints, and synthetic decorations. They encouraged households to opt for eco-friendly clay idols and natural decorations like leaves, flowers, and organic colours. Eco-Friendly Idol Promotion: NSS students partnered with local artisans and environmental NGOs to promote and distribute eco-friendly Ganesha idols. These idols were made from clay and natural materials that dissolve easily in water without harming aquatic life. Designated Immersion Points: On the day of Ganesh Visarjan, NSS students assisted in setting up and managing artificial immersion tanks and ponds. These tanks were set up by local authorities to reduce pollution in natural water bodies. NSS volunteers helped devotees immerse their idols in these tanks and explained how this practice helps in preserving the environment. Post-Visarjan Clean-Up: After the immersion process, NSS students conducted clean-up drives at the immersion points to remove waste materials such as flowers, plastics, and decorations. This activity ensured that the areas remained clean and that non-biodegradable waste did not enter water bodies.
