## Report on “Swachh Vari, Swasth Waari, Nirmal Wari, Harit Wari”, Campaign

Date: 12/07/2019

On 12/07/2019, the NSS Unit of Tuljaram Chaturchand College of Arts Science and Commerce, Baramati, actively participated in the Savitribai Phule Pune University SPPU initiative, “Swachh Vari, Swasth Waari, Nirmal Wari, Harit Wari”, aimed at ensuring a clean, healthy, and green environment during the *Waari* pilgrimage. This initiative aligns with the vision of making the annual pilgrimage not only spiritually enriching but also environmentally responsible. Volunteers from the NSS unit contributed to various activities promoting cleanliness, health, hygiene, and tree plantation. The objective of this campaign was to support the government’s mission to maintain cleanliness and promote eco-friendly practices during the *Pandharpur Waari*, an annual pilgrimage in Maharashtra. 
